## REGISTRATION AND REGULATIONS

St George's International School's Extra-Curricular Activities can be booked via a club booking system called SOCS. The registration and allocation process in SOCS is automated and allocates clubs according to preferences, not 'first come, first served'. You may specify your preferences per day and the system will randomly pick your choices.

We have provided instructions on how to use this system on My School Portal. Please click on the Buses, Clubs, Music tab on the home page to review the instructions in the format of a PDF and video, which walks you through the process.

To sign up students for clubs, you will be able to access SOCS via My School Portal between Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> July 10am until Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> August 2025.

Confirmation of club spaces will be emailed by Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2025.

Once registration on SOCS has closed you will be able to enquire regarding club availability by emailing [clubs@st-georges.lu](mailto:clubs@st-georges.lu). If the club, you are interested in is at full capacity you will be asked to log back into SOCS to register for the waiting list, which will be available from Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2025.

### Regulations:

1. For health and safety reasons, each extra-curricular activity has an age limit, as well as a maximum number of participants, both of which are non-negotiable.
2. Extra-curricular activities will run from Wednesday, 3 September 2025 to Thursday, 2 July 2026 unless otherwise stated in the notes on page 10 and following. Extra-curricular activities will not run on days when school lessons finish at noon. If sessions cannot run on PTSC (Parent-Teacher-Student Conference) evenings, we will inform you in the newsletter.

3. In the event of a Primary School activity session being cancelled, we will inform you as soon as possible. Should we need to cancel a club at short notice, such as on the same day and you are unable to pick up your child/children at 3.15pm, we will endeavour to place them in After-School Care, although this cannot be guaranteed, as demand for After-School Care is exceptionally high.
4. When Secondary clubs are affected by inclement weather, without the possibility to use indoor space, students will be able to leave the site. Billing will not be reviewed on these occasions.
5. To cancel club attendance for the following term, email [clubs@st-georges.lu](mailto:clubs@st-georges.lu) and inform the respective Club Supervisor (through [clubs@st-georges.lu](mailto:clubs@st-georges.lu)) two weeks before the end of each term.
6. New students joining St George's during the school year can join extra-curricular activities at any time, provided there are places available, after receiving confirmation from the Clubs Secretary.
7. For Primary students who sign up for extra-curricular activities running at 4.30pm, offsite supervision is required between 3.15pm and 4.30pm by the arrangement of the parent(s).
8. Care of music instruments used for clubs: Instruments are the responsibility of the owner or the person who signed the rental agreement. We recommend that all instruments are insured.
9. All instruments and cases must be labelled clearly, with name, class and the St George's International School Luxembourg address and phone number. On lesson days, instruments must not be left on the floor of the corridors but either in the classroom or in the instrumental storeroom. Please see the Music Brochure for additional information.
10. Some outdoor clubs do not have the option of running inside in case of bad weather. Therefore, students will need to come with the appropriate clothing or we would call parents

to request that students are collected earlier than 4.30pm or 5.30pm. It may be that those sessions are cancelled at short notice due to weather uncertainties.

11. Outdoor clubs will not have the option of using the school changing rooms. Therefore, all students who attend sports club are asked to dress appropriately on the day.
12. When starting a new afternoon extra-curricular activity, please remember to cancel the student's place on the school bus by contacting [reception@st-georges.lu](mailto:reception@st-georges.lu).

## CHARGES FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- Charges for each club are stated in the Activities Information tables on pages 27 to 33, and will be billed by term in November 2025, March and July 2026.
- Students who join after the activity has begun are billed for the full term.
- We do not accept cancellations mid-term, except for those with extenuating circumstances and all clubs will be billed for the full term, whether or not your child/children continue to attend.
- The school issues invoices for "Extras" (such as After-School Care, canteen, Clubs and individual music lessons) four times a year (November, March, May and July). These invoices cannot be divided by activity. For instance, we cannot bill Club activities solely to Parent 1 and Tuesday's After-School Care solely to Parent 2, nor can we charge all Monday meals to Parent 1 and piano lessons to Parent 2. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.
- Prices are subject to increase by 2.5% in relation to any salary indexation.
- MERITE JEUNESSE: We will accept cancellations for Merite Jeunesse by Friday, 17 October 2025. This will result in a €50 administrative fee. For any cancellations after this date, the refund will be calculated by the Accounting team, considering any excursions and weekly Clubs sessions which may, or may not, have been attended.

Please note: We keep the cost of extra-curricular activities to a minimum to allow for the occasional cancellation because of staff absence due to illness, training, school trip etc. We always try to cover any absences, but this is not always possible. Therefore, should one or two sessions be cancelled per term, there is no reduction in cost.

## PICK UP REGULATIONS FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS

Parents collect students from Gate 9 (just past door to Reception).

Parents are required to stand within school boundaries, behind the small gate, so the Club Supervisor can mark the student out of the register before leaving the site.

Gate 9 will be opened five minutes before the allocated pick-up time and close five minutes after.

Once you have collected your child/children, please leave the site promptly to ensure safe and easy pick-up for everyone.

Any Primary student not collected on time after a club activity will be taken to After-School Care and a charge will be applied. Parents will be asked to wait for their child/ren until the next available pick-up time which could be 5pm or 5.30pm.

Please note that a late pick-up charge of €50 may be billed to you if you collect a student late without extenuating circumstances. Students may also have their place in clubs withdrawn as a result of repeated tardiness.

## THE ARTS

### **Art and Craft (Years 2 - 3)**

Get creative and let your imagination shine! In Art and Crafts Club, you'll explore colours, textures and fun materials to make your own masterpieces. From painting and drawing to cutting, gluing, and crafting, every session is full of hands-on fun. Perfect for young artists who love to create and explore.

### **Art and Craft (Years 7 - 10)**

Students will have the chance to explore a diverse array of artistic techniques, including sculpting, collage, watercolour, paper construction, painting and more. At the end of the year, a selection of the most outstanding works will be showcased at the annual Art Exhibition.

### **Beginner Strings Ensemble (Year 1)**

Beginner Strings Ensemble provides a fun and friendly environment for string players at the beginning of their careers to play in a group setting. Throughout the school year we will work hard on new pieces and learn how to play music with other string players. If you play a string instrument (violin, viola, cello), this would be the perfect club for you. This club is open to all St George's students with previous strings lessons.

### **Beginner Strings Ensemble (Year 2)**

Same as above but for older students.

### **Creative Art (Years 1 - 2)**

Our Creative Arts Club offers a fun way for children to explore different art forms each week! From watercolours and acrylics to clay sculpting, paper weaving, and origami, there's always something new to try and develop our students' artistic skills.

**Design Drawing (Years 3 – 4)**

Students will have the exciting opportunity to design their own unique T-shirts, turning their creative ideas into wearable art. These custom designs will be professionally printed on fabric, allowing students to proudly wear and take home their masterpieces. Each school year, they can create and keep up to two personalised T-shirts, making for a memorable and stylish keepsake. Starting from 8 September 2025.

**Design Drawing (Years 5 – 6)**

Same as above but for older students. Starting from 8 September 2025.

**Digital Illustration (Years 7 – 10)**

Students will work on iPads, with the option to bring their own device. This club simulates the role of a digital illustrator, with students responding to client-style briefs and focusing on composition, colour and lettering. We'll design visuals for the school, including posters and banners, using apps like Adobe Fresco and Procreate.

**Drama (Years 7 – 9)**

Drama Club will give students the opportunity to practise fundamental performance skills as well as developing an understanding of other design roles in theatre. The club will work towards a full play production just before Easter and students can apply/audition for the roles they want to complete, from actor to lighting to costume designer.

**Guitar/Ukulele Ensemble (Years 5 – 13)**

The Guitar Club is a chance for existing guitar students to develop the skills and enjoyment of creating and performing music with others. Introducing elements from all styles of guitar and the skills related to performing in ensembles or bands, the club gives a performance and collaborative outlet to solo instrument learning. This club is open to all St George's students with previous guitar lessons.

**Junior Choir (Years 1 - 2)**

Junior Choir is designed for Year 1 and Year 2 students to develop strong singing technique and musical skills as part of a performing group. The club features engaging and challenging songs that students can connect with. To maintain their place in the choir, students are expected to participate in at least two performances during the year.

**Masterpiece Makers (Years 2 - 4)**

Masterpiece Makers is a vibrant art club in which creativity takes centre stage. Children will explore a variety of artistic techniques including painting, sculpting and drawing, while developing their skills and experimenting with different materials. Through collaborative projects and group activities, the club encourages self-expression, teamwork and lasting friendships.

**Mini Maestros (Year 1)**

Mini Maestros Club offers the musical building blocks for young musicians. Students learn through group activities in a structured, enjoyable and stimulating way, appropriate to their development's mental and physical stages. The Mini Maestro Clubs curriculum follows Kodály Inspired Music Education, which develops musicianship through singing and aims to enhance students' musical abilities while taking instrumental lessons. Using their voice profoundly affects the child's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development, and is the most direct way of making a musical response.

**Mini Maestros (Year 2)**

Same as above for older students.

**Mini Maestros (Year 3)**

Same as above for older students.

**Percussion Ensemble (Years 6 - 13)**

This ensemble will focus on developing a higher level of performance abilities through fun and engaging rehearsals and performance opportunities. This club is by invitation only and is only

available to students who are taking private instrumental lessons at St George's or are enrolled with another recognised music school. If interested, please apply to [music@st-georges.lu](mailto:music@st-georges.lu).

### **Primary Choir (Years 3 - 6)**

The St George's Primary Choir represents the school publicly in performances throughout the year. Our performances at charity events help instil the caring St George's ethos. Our weekly voice-training activities show dedication to achieving excellent singing. We challenge our students to perform from memory in two and three parts in various languages. Please note all students are expected to attend in at least two performances to keep their space in the club.

### **Violin (Years 2 - 3)**

Violin Club provides a fun and friendly opportunity for string players at the beginning of their careers to play in a group setting. We will work hard on new pieces and learn how to play music with other string players. This is restricted to those who enrolled in Beginner Strings or play a string instrument.

## SPORTS, DANCE AND GAMES

### **Basketball (Years 3 - 6)**

Come and experience the fun and excitement of learning and playing basketball. Fun and energetic club for boys and girls alike.

### **Breakfast Basketball (Years 7 - 13)**

Come and experience the fun and excitement of learning and playing basketball. Fun and energetic club for boys and girls alike.

### **Cricket (Years 4 - 6)**

Provides an engaging and fun introduction to basic skills and rules of cricket for children of all abilities. Progression of bowling, batting, fielding and wicket-keeping skills to a standard where they can compete in matches. No equipment required just a desire to be a team player and a good sport

### **Cricket (Years 7 - 9)**

Same as above but for older students.

### **Dance – Theatre (Year 3)**

Dance activities are based on storytelling and are prepared by the club supervisor specifically for the students. The club will introduce children to Latin, ballroom and other genres of dancing. The club will improve body co-ordination, increase self-confidence and leadership, and encourage students to become comfortable with performing in public. Students will have plenty of opportunities for group work both by leading a team and being part of a team. Starting from 8 September 2025.

### **Dance – Theatre (Year 4)**

**Dance Fitness (Years 3 - 4)**

Helps develop a healthy lifestyle and incorporate fitness as a natural part of children's lives by making fitness fun. Classes incorporate key childhood development elements like leadership, respect, teamwork, confidence, self-esteem, memory, creativity and coordination.

**Football (Year 2)**

Ready to kick off some fun? Join our Football Club and learn the basics of the beautiful game. From dribbling and passing to teamwork and fair play, this club is perfect for young players who want to build their skills and enjoy the game with friends. All abilities welcome, just bring your boots and a big smile.

**Football (Years 3 - 4)**

Same as above but for older students.

**Football (Years 5 - 6)**

Same as above but for older students.

**Football for Boys (Years 5 - 9)**

With numerous local and international football tournaments on the horizon for this academic year, Football Club will help to develop our Under 11 and Under 14 teams and ready them for competition. As well as developing individual skills and technique, we will look at team structure, understanding of position and patterns of play to get students ready to represent St George's over the next year.

**Football for Girls (Years 5 - 7)**

Football Club will help develop confidence in individual skills, technique, understanding of positions and patterns of play for our Under 11 and Under 14 teams well prepared to represent the school in the coming year. All abilities and levels of experience are welcome as we grow and empower the number of girls participating in football at St George's.

### **Mérite Jeunesse / Duke of Edinburgh's International Award (Years 9 -13)**

The Mérite Jeunesse (MJ) programme is part of The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award, which is the world's leading youth achievement award, bringing together practical experiences and equipping young people with skills for life. There are three levels: Bronze, Silver and Gold. The award is based on long-term participation in physical activity, skill and volunteering.

There is a fourth section, which is often the highlight – the Expedition. At Bronze level, students complete a two-day, one-night expedition. At Silver level, it is three days and two nights, and at Gold level, it is four days and three nights and there is an additional residential project to be completed. Each level of the award requires two expeditions – practice and qualifying. See <https://merite.jeunesse.lu/> for more information.

Please note that students must attend each MJ session to be adequately prepared for the expeditions. If a student does not attend two or more sessions, they may be asked to leave the Merite Jeunesse Club.

Please note that the minimum age for Silver Mérite Jeunesse is 15 years and Gold Mérite Jeunesse is 16 years. Students must be turning the minimum age by March 2026 to start the requested level. It is only possible to enrol in Silver from Years 10 to 13 and for Gold from Years 11 to 13.

#### Registration

1. Priority will be given to students who have already completed Bronze or Silver MJ at St George's (as evidenced by having at least three of the four sections on the Online Record Book signed off) and who wish to continue into Silver or Gold MJ. It is possible to enrol in Silver or Gold without having done previous levels.
2. First MJ sessions for new joiners will take place during the week of 22 October and weekly thereafter. Once groups have completed their route planning before each expedition, their award leader can give them permission to not attend individual sessions thereafter. Start

dates for returning MJ participants will be communicated by the award leader to the students via Teams. It will be the responsibility of the participants to ensure they are aware.

3. Sessions for each level will be held at 3.30pm or at 4.30pm on a Thursday and/or Monday/Wednesday, to be confirmed at a later stage. Award leaders may make mandatory sessions at other times for groups who are not on track to complete their route planning by the deadline. Groups who do not complete their route planning three weeks before the dates of their expedition risk being removed from that expedition.
4. Expedition dates will be published before January 2026.
5. Expeditions will start from end of March 2026 at the earliest. It is possible that some expeditions will take place at the start or end of school holidays to minimise the time that students are absent from school.

The cost is per level and includes participation in Merite Jeunesse, all training sessions, the practice expedition, the qualifying expedition and borrowing of equipment.

### **Netball (Years 3 - 6)**

An opportunity to be active, learn new skills and be part of a team. This club will teach children how to play the exciting game of netball which can improve verbal and social skills as well as overall fitness.

### **Rugby – Primary (Years 4 - 6)**

The Primary Rugby Club will allow students to develop their skills in a safe and confidence-building environment. Why should I try rugby? Rugby is a team game played with an oval ball that may be kicked, carried and passed from hand to hand. Rugby teaches us to be resilient as we continue to play even after we make mistakes. We rely on our teammates, and they rely on us – the ultimate team sport. Suitable for boys and girls, whether you are a first timer or the seasoned pro, join us to be challenged, keep fit and have fun.

**Rugby – Secondary (Years 7 - 11)**

The Secondary Rugby Club will allow students to develop their skills in a safe and confidence-building environment. In 2024/2025 St George's attended the Rosslyn Park 7s in London, as well as participating in the school's first 15-a-side fixtures versus local clubs. This year our fixture calendar will continue to grow as we attend more fixtures and tournaments both domestically and abroad. Why should I try rugby? Rugby is a team game played with an oval ball that may be kicked, carried and passed from hand to hand. Rugby teaches us to be resilient as we continue to play even after we make mistakes. We rely on our teammates and they rely on us – the ultimate team sport. Suitable for boys and girls, whether you are a first timer or the seasoned pro, join us to be challenged, keep fit and have fun.

Please note that for the contact parts of training and playing, students will play in their respective boys' and girls' teams.

**Volleyball (Years 5 – 6)**

Bump, set, spike – let's play volleyball! Join our Volleyball Club to learn the basics of this exciting team sport. You'll build skills such as serving, passing and teamwork while having loads of fun with friends. Whether you're new to the game or already love it, everyone is welcome on the court.

**Volleyball (Years 7 – 9)**

### **Academic Support Club (Years 7 - 13, previously known as Homework Club)**

The Academic Support Club is a quiet, supportive space for Secondary students to complete homework and study independently. Students are expected to bring their own work and use the time productively. A staff member will be present to offer guidance and support when needed. Laptops will be available only for students who can demonstrate a specific need. Mondays to Fridays from 3.30am to 5pm. One session per week costs €232 per term, two sessions per week cost €464 per term, etc, prices being subject to increase by 2.5% in relation to any salary indexation.

Students must pre-register on My School Portal, for one day per week up to five days per week, for a full term, with automatic rollover.

Registration is based on a 'first come, first served' basis with a maximum 15 students. Parents can register through My School Portal at the same date as Extra-Curricular Activities. If the club reaches capacity, students can register on the waiting list for a chance to join when a spot becomes available. The club starts on Monday, 8 September 2025 and finish on Friday, 26 June 2026 (a week before school finishes, due to the number of events in school the last week of school).

We ask students leave the premises promptly when they have finished attending their club.

### **After-School Enrichment Club (Years 7 - 13)**

The After-School Enrichment Club offers a balanced after-school routine combining study, reading and social time. The daily programme includes:

- 30 minutes of homework completion
- 30 minutes of individual reading and
- 30 minutes of social activities (board games, etc)

Please note: No computers will be available during this club. Students should bring any materials they need for their homework and reading.

Mondays to Fridays from 3.30am to 5pm. One session per week costs €232 per term, two sessions per week cost €464 per term, etc, prices being subject to increase by 2.5% in relation to any salary indexation.

Students must pre-register on My School Portal, for one day per week up to five days per week, for a full term, with automatic rollover.

Registration is based on a 'first come, first served' basis with a maximum 15 students. Parents can register through My School Portal at the same date as Extra-Curricular Activities. If the club reaches capacity, students can register on the waiting list for a chance to join when a spot becomes available. Both clubs start on Monday, 8 September 2025 and finish on Friday, 26 June 2026 (a week before school finishes, due to the number of events in school the last week of school).

We ask students leave the premises promptly when they have finished attending their club.

### **Book Nook (Years 3 – 6)**

Calling all young readers in Milepost 2 and Milepost 3! Step into a world of stories, adventures and imagination in our cozy after-school Book Club in the Primary School Library. This special time is perfect for students who want a quiet space to read, unwind and explore books they love. Whether you're diving into a new novel, flipping through picture books, or just curious to learn more, the library is your space to enjoy at your own pace. Come discover hidden gems, ask the librarian your burning bookish questions and spend quality time with friends who love to read as much as you do. This is your time to relax, read and explore at your own pace and in your own way.

### **Chess (Years 3 – 6)**

We will look to develop the skills of any students interested in playing chess, regardless of ability level. We will have themed weeks, collaborative events and healthy competitions designed to support students' understanding of the fundamentals of chess.

### **Cooking (Years 5 – 6)**

Put on your apron and get ready to cook up some fun! In Cooking Club, you'll learn to make tasty, simple recipes while exploring kitchen skills, healthy eating and teamwork. From sweet treats to savoury snacks, every session is a delicious adventure. No experience needed, just bring your curiosity and appetite.

**Creative Writing (Years 7 – 13)**

Let your imagination run wild! This is the perfect space for students who love to write short stories, poetry, journal entries and both descriptive and narrative pieces. Whether you're dreaming up new worlds or capturing everyday moments with vivid detail, this club is all about expressing yourself through words and exploring the power of storytelling.

**Debating (Years 10 – 13)**

Come along to Debating Club and let off some steam. Discuss the key issues of the day – locally, nationally or internationally. Join in with considered discussions about topics and issues that you feel strongly about, you set the agenda – not us. Take the opportunity to develop essential skills and to take part in local, national and international debating competitions. Due to the complex nature of some of the topics we debate, this club is only suitable for students in Year 10 and above.

**EAL – English as an Additional Language (Years 6 – 13)**

This club aims to improve the vocabulary and literacy of students with English as an additional language. It is a fun and engaging opportunity to develop both written and conversational skills. Activities could include games, projects, presentations, research – a varied program that will meet the needs of the students signed up. There will be opportunities for independent work and working as a team.

**French Conversation (Years 7 – 9)**

Are you eager to improve your French while having fun? Our conversation club is perfect for you. Designed for young students, this club offers a unique opportunity to practise the language in a friendly and dynamic environment. Through songs, games, stories and cultural activities, young learners will practise speaking and listening while exploring the richness of French language and culture.

**Kitchen Garden (Years 7 – 11)**

Students will engage in hands-on agricultural activities, including soil preparation, seed planting, irrigation setup and harvesting a variety of crops such as potatoes, tomatoes, berries and cucumbers. They will then use their harvest to create a range of sweet and savoury dishes, while also

learning preservation techniques like drying and jarring. To share the fruits of their labour, students will sell their produce during school breaks and at the Summer Fayre.

### **KS5 Enrichment Club (Years 12 - 13)**

Students receive expert advice and support with university applications, including help with personal statements, motivational letters, and application forms. They are guided in developing research skills to stay informed about changes in university admissions in the UK, Europe, and globally. Additionally, students benefit from Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG) on essential life skills such as cooking, laundry, cleaning, time management, budgeting, banking, and saving. Support also covers mental health and wellbeing, including self-care and seeking help, as well as social and communication skills like making friends, conflict resolution, and professional communication. Practical knowledge such as basic first aid, using public transport, and understanding tenancy agreements is also provided.

### **Luxembourgish for Beginners (Years 2)**

Students receive expert advice and support with university applications, including help with personal statements, motivational letters, and application forms. They are guided in developing research skills to stay informed about changes in university admissions in the UK, Europe, and globally. Additionally, students benefit from Information, Advice, and Guidance (IAG) on essential life skills such as cooking, laundry, cleaning, time management, budgeting, banking, and saving. ### **Secondary Repair Tech Café (Years 7 – 11)**

Students will learn how to carry out small simple repairs and experiment with basic electronics and energy. Later in the year, students will offer a basic repair service to the school community to make use of their repair skills.

**STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) (Years 2 – 4)**

Fun, hands-on projects with a different focus and different challenges each week. Activities included building bridges with lollipop sticks, creating marble runs, making hovercrafts with balloons and more.
